## 4a GOODS TO DECLARE\*

**• PROHIBITED GOODS:**

- Habit forming drugs
- Military weapons
- Explosives & fireworks
- Poisons
- Cigarettes weighing more than 2 kg per 1000
- Counterfeit goods

**• RESTRICTED GOODS:**

- Firearms
- SA banknotes of more than R25 000
- Gold coins, stamps & unprocessed gold
- Animals and their products
- Plants and their products
- Certain types of medicine

**• GOODS NOT FOR PERSONAL USE**

\* A sample of the main goods to declare

## 4b NOTHING TO DECLARE\*

**• DUTY-FREE ALLOWANCE:**

- Sporting & recreational equipment (international visitors)
- Up to 2 litres of wine (not for minors)
- Up to 1 litre of spirits (not for minors)
- Up to 200 cigarettes, 20 cigars & 250g tobacco (not for minors)
- Up to 50ml perfumery & 250ml eau de toilette
- \*\*Up to R5000 worth of new or used goods

\*Goods in excess of these quantities should be declared in the Red Channel.  
 \*\*R25 000 if arriving from Botswana, Lesotho, Namibia or Swaziland

Visitors to South Africa may claim back VAT on goods bought in South Africa, provided that such goods are presented for inspection upon departure. VAT Inspection as well as Refund Counters are situated in departure terminals at international airports in the country.
