IMPLEMENTATION DATE FOR AMENDED RULES FOR REGISTRATION AND LICENSING AND THE NEW REGISTRATION, LICENSING AND ACCREDITATION (RLA) SYSTEM

The amended rules of registration and licensing under sections 8, 59A and 60 of the Customs and Excise Act, 1964, as well as the electronic system providing for such changes, will be implemented as from 20 April 2020.

The RLA system is being developed in phases, and implementation of Release 1 of the system will comprise a roll-out on eFiling as well as at Customs offices, where Branch Front End (BFE) capturing of applications by officers will take place.

The RLA system is an electronic platform for the submission of new registration and licensing applications. Release 1, which will be rolled out on 20 April, caters for electronic submission of the following applications:

Applications not yet catered for electronically must still be submitted in paper format at a Customs and Excise office. Please take note that none of the Excise applications are catered for electronically yet.

Clients wishing to submit applications on the new system are encouraged to register for eFiling in the meantime (if not already registered).
